

Council seeks drain report

THE Subang Jaya Municipal Council is urging all residents' associations to submit reports on the status of drainage in their respective housing areas.

Councillor Awtar Singh, who is in the MPSJ Infrastructure Committee, said the report would help identify clogged and damaged drains in view of the current flood season. He also said it would offer an accurate picture of the capacity of the drains.

"For instance, based on feedback,

we know that the drains in Kampung Baru Batu 14, Puchong, Bukit Puchong and Puchong Utama are not enough to handle the increased water flow following heavy rains.

"All reports from the residents' associations should be submitted within a week to enable the council to take immediate preventive action. The reports should be addressed to the council president," he added.

According to Awtar, the report would also help identify flood-prone areas that the council is unaware of. He asked residents'

associations to play a proactive role in the matter to help prevent untoward incidents.

He also urged residents associations' representatives to report digging carried out by any parties in their areas to verify if the act was legal or not.

He said certain irresponsible parties did not patch up roads after digging in the area, creating water-logged holes.

The council will take action on the parties involved if they are found guilty of damaging the roads or carrying out road works in an irresponsible manner.
